Students must have and maintain a 2.75 GPA

General Education Courses

Students must earn a B- or higher to meet partial program entry requirements in the following courses: **ENG 1030, MATH 1000, COMM 1402, BIO 1000, HIST 2303 or 2304, and EMSE 2802.**

Students must also earn a C or higher in the following additional courses after acceptance into the program and before Pre-Professional Internship (EMSE 3802): **HIST 2304, MATH 1010**, and a science course (options include **CHEM 1010, ASTR 1100, GEOL 1200, ES 1400, and PHYS 1000 or 1400**). Other college-level science courses are acceptable as well.

Academic Major

Students majoring in Elementary Education are required to take an academic major in liberal arts, mathematics, or science as outlined in the Kean University catalog. Some overlap with General Education may occur, in which case the courses that overlap must also be a C grade or higher. Some majors require a greater number of credits and additional cognates. Check specific departmental grade requirements.

Professional Education Courses

All students must earn a B- or higher in all Professional Education courses and a Satisfactory grade in **EMSE 3802** and **EMSE 4812**. **EDUC 3000** and **EDUC 3400** must be completed prior to taking **EMSE 3802**. **EMSE 3123, EMSE 3140, EMSE 3300** and **EMSE 3903** must be completed prior to taking **EMSE 4812** and **EMSE 4900**.

EMSE 4900 Senior Seminar and **EMSE 4812** Professional Internship *must* be taken together and no other course registration is permitted.

ALL TEACHER CANDIDATES ARE REQUIRED TO COMPLETE THE TEACHER WORK SAMPLE PORTFOLIO BEFORE GRADUATION

Writing Emphasis Requirement: All students are required to complete a "Writing Emphasis" (WE) COURSE. The WE course should be within the major program. **EMSE 3140** satisfies this requirement. Consult your academic major program adviser (i.e. History, Earth Science, etc.) for any requirements they have in their respective program.

Praxis I: All students entering the Elementary Education Program are required to pass the Praxis I exam as an entrance requirement for declared status. Students must earn a passing score on all three parts of Praxis I exam (math, writing, and reading) to become eligible to apply to the Elementary Education program for declared status.

Praxis II: The State of New Jersey requires a passing score on the Elementary Education: Content Knowledge Praxis II exam (#10014) prior to the start of their Professional Field Experience.

Testing and Placement

Required GE Distribution Courses

ENG 2403 is a required Humanities Distribution course with an emphasis on diversity. Prereq: CS 0412 if required by placement testing; ENG 1030 or equivalent.

HIST 1000 is a required Social Sciences Distribution course with an emphasis on diversity. Prereq: CS 0412 if required by placement testing; ENG 1031/1032 or ENG 1033/1034 if required by placement testing; May be taken concurrently with ENG 1030.

Foreign Language Credit

The three credits for a foreign language that may satisfy the GE Disciplinary/Interdisciplinary Distribution Requirement are awarded only upon successful completion of the second of two semesters of study at the introductory or intermediate level.

Credit for the first semester may be used as elective credit.

Major/GE Capstone Course

A Capstone course is a major course that satisfies three credits of GE requirements.

Each major guide sheet will count three credits for the Capstone as either GE credits or major credits, but not both.

UNIVERSITY REQUIREMENT

Writing-Emphasis Requirement

All students are required to complete one "Writing-Emphasis" course. The "W-E" course must be within the major portion of your program. Consult your major program advisor for specific information.
